

Guide to the Leona C. Johnson collection, c. 1857-1999 (bulk: c. 1917-1999)

Biographical Note: Leona Catherine Johnston (1907-2004) was born to George Nathaniel Johnston (1870-1918) and Emma A. Haynes (1873-1930) in Sudbury, Massachusetts, on December 6, 1907. Via maternal line, Leona was a tenth-generation descendant of Walter Haynes (1583-1664), an early settler in Sudbury. In 1926, she graduated from Sudbury High School, where she was nicknamed "Skeeziks." Leona was also president of the French Club and the History Club, respectively. She went on to graduate from the Framingham Normal School (present-day Framingham State University) with a Bachelor of Education and began as an elementary teacher at the Sudbury Center School in 1928. A year later, Leona married Burchell Montanye Johnson (1899-1969) and they had two children: Robert Neil Johnson (1932-2005) and Elinor Frances Johnson, later Banks (1933-2017). The family lived at 301 Old Lancaster Road. Leona also gained employment at several Sudbury-based businesses such as Dad's Wayside Lunch, Marian Heath Greeting Cards, and the Wayside Inn. She held memberships with the Sudbury Historical Society and the Sudbury Woman's Club. Leona remained in Sudbury throughout her life and passed away at Sudbury Pines Extended Care on May 11, 2004. Leona was later buried at the Old Town Cemetery.

Scope Note: This collection consists of correspondence, newspaper clippings, notebooks, photographs, postcards, programs, reports, scrapbooks, and other miscellaneous documents. Items primarily document a variety of events in the late nineteenth-century and twentieth century history of Sudbury. Topics largely include the Haynes Family, the Sudbury Public Schools, the Sudbury Tercentenary, and the Wayside Inn.

Acquisition Information: This collection was donated to the Sudbury Historical Society by the relatives of Leona C. Johnson to the Sudbury Historical Society in two parts: by her daughter-in-law, Janet Anderson Johnson, in 2006 and 2011, respectively; and by her granddaughter, Cathy B. Smith, in 2009.

Separated Materials: Due to size restrictions and preservation requirements, the Sudbury Center School photograph album (2006.036.0024) and the annual town reports from 1937 through 1956 (2011.016) are housed separately.

Haynes was a native of Sudbury and worked as an officer (since circa 1900) and a turnkey (since 1912) at the Charlestown State Prison. He was also part of the Sudbury Brass Brand.
